# PREVENTING CONFLICT & BUILDING REGIONAL SECURITY

Challenges arise when nuclear weapons and conventional conflict intersect. Our strategy focuses on improving regional security in areas where there is both conventional conflict and nuclear threats, particularly in the Middle East and South Asia. We encourage increasing the influence of civil society voices in these negotiations and dialogues. Partners like the 1947 Partition Archive — an oral history organization in Berkeley — collect and preserve firsthand accounts of the Partition of India in 1947. At age 104, MIRZA CHANGEZI (pictured above shortly before passing away) memorized 300 years of family stories with roots in Persia.

# Financial Report<sup>1</sup> Fiscal Year 2021 (July 1, 2020-June 30, 2021)

Ploughshares Fund is proud to report another strong year of support from our donors. To ensure maximum impact, all annual contributions go directly toward grantmaking and programmatic activity, with nothing subtracted for administration or development (these are paid for by the Fund's Board of Directors and a draw from our capital reserve). This year, 77% of our total budget was spent on grantmaking and programmatic

In fiscal year 2021, Ploughshares Fund's long-term investments gained \$7,562,677 compared to a loss of \$325,789 in 2020. Of the 2021 total assets, \$32,148,853 is held in our long-term capital reserves, which were established to ensure our ability to continue our mission to reduce and eliminate nuclear weapons in face of the challenges and opportunities that may arise. This portfolio is actively managed by an investment committee with the counsel of an investment manager.
